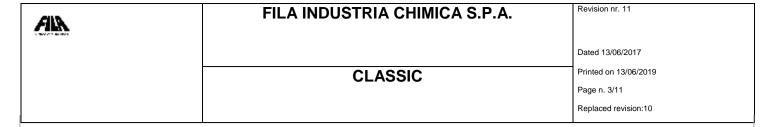
SECTION 4. First aid measures

8.2. Exposure controls
